





RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON, NEW YORK,
AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF KINGSTON AS LEAD AGENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF
SEQR AND TYPE II DETERMINATION FOR THE NYS DEC W.Q.I.P. – ROUND II
(UPTOWN PARKING AREA GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT)

WHEREAS, the City of Kingston herein called the “Municipality”, after consideration of the various aspects of the problem and study of available data, has hereby determined that certain work, as described in its application and attachments, herein called the “Project” is desirable, is in the public interest, and is required in order to implement the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Conservation Law (ECL) authorizes State assistance to municipalities for water quality improvement projects by means of a contract and the Municipality deems it to be in the public interest and benefit under this law to enter into a contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION-1. That the Common Council of the City of Kingston authorizes the Mayor of the City of Kingston to be the authorized representative to act in behalf of the Municipality’s governing body in all matters related to State assistances under ECL Articles 17, 51, and 56 and/or any applicable federal grant provisions. The representative is also authorized to make application, execute the State Assistance Contract, submit Project documentation, and otherwise act for the Municipality’s governing body in all matters related to the Project and to State assistance.

SECTION-2. That the Municipality agrees that it will fund its portion of the cost of the Project and that funds will be available to initiate the Project’s field work within twelve (12) months of written approval of its application by the Department of Environmental Conservation.

SECTION 3. That one (1) certified copy of this Resolution be prepared and sent to the Albany office of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.


