In Resolution 162 and 163 of 2018, the Council has previously authorized the project and funding in the amount of \$100,000. We proceeded with design of the project, and we expect to open bids on November 18 of this year.

When originally conceived, the exact extent and types of repairs that would be needed were still unknown. Although the project was originally conceived as a manhole rehabilitation or replacement only, based on our investigations it is now proposed to replace 400 linear feet of gravity sewer in addition to the originally planned manhole rehabilitation.

Based on the increased scope of work, the project cost, including design, construction, and construction administration / inspection is now estimated at \$460,000. My request is for an additional \$360,000 in funding by bonding so that the project may be awarded shortly after the planned Nov. 18 bid opening.

Please consider adding this to an upcoming meeting of the Finance and Audit Committee.

Honorable Members of the Common Council:

Pursuant to the Charter of the City of Kingston, New York, Chapter 16-5 and Section 395-29 of the Administrative Code of the City of Kingston, NY:

#### C16-5:

Water charges shall be a lien upon real estate until paid. Annually, before December 1, the Board of Water Commissioners shall transmit a statement to the Common Council of water charges in arrears for more than three months, with a description of the affected property. The Common Council, upon receipt of the statement, shall cause such unpaid charges, with 6% thereon, to be levied in addition to the general city tax at the time of the next levy, and such charges may be enforced in the same manner as provided in the City Charter for the collection of property taxes. Unpaid water charges remaining unpaid for a prescribed period of time subject the affected property to tax foreclosure. The Comptroller will pay the Water Commissioners for unpaid water charges on or before June 10 in each year.

#### S395-29:

In the event that water rents are in arrears for more than three months, the water rents and interest and charges thereon shall become a lien upon the real estate against which the water rents shall have been laid, levied or charged.

A breakdown of the amounts that are to be re-levied on the 2022 general tax bills is attached.

Re: Fair Street Extension and Easement

Dear President Shaut,

As you are aware, pursuant to Resolution no. 43 of 2021, the Common Council approved the conveyance of property owned by the City of Kingston at 21 North Front Street, the former parking garage, to the Kingston Local Development Corporation for development in accordance with the request for qualifications previously issued by my office. Subsequently, the Kingston Local Development Corporation has entered into a land development agreement to convey the premises to the Kingstonian Development, LLC for said development.

As part of this development project, it will be necessary to partially abandon Fair Street Extension and to grant certain easements to the developer to accommodate the construction of the commercial building and parking garage and the pedestrian bridge to be constructed over Schwenk Drive.

I am therefore recommending to the Council that they authorize the partial abandonment of Fair Street Extension pursuant to statute and this may require a public hearing. Also, I am recommending that the Council authorize the conveyance of an easement to the Kingstonian Development, LLC for construction/location of those portions of the development project that fall within the boundaries of Fair St Ext. provided that the developer agree to be responsible for all maintenance of Fair Street Extension. I am also recommending that the Council authorize the conveyance of an easement to Kingstonian Development, LLC to allow for an ADA compliant pedestrian access bridge over Schwenk Drive and the location of structural support for the pedestrian bridge and elevator tower adjacent to Schwenk Drive as necessary.
