### 2024 July/August Grant Season: Summary of Applications

### NYS CFA – City of Kingston as Applicant, Due July 31, 2024

#### 1. Kingston Citywide Parking Study

Funding Source:

**Empire State Development** 

Strategic Planning & Feasibility Studies Program

Total Grant Project Cost:

\$200,000

Grant Match Required:

50% = \$100,000

The City will request grant funds to support the procurement of a consulting firm to conduct a comprehensive study of existing parking options across all neighborhoods. The consultant will inventory and map existing public and private parking, analyze needs and opportunities, and make recommendations to address concerns. Strategy and program recommendations will include but not be limited to management, connectivity, physical parking changes, regulatory and zoning changes, signage, education, marketing, and public-private partnerships.

#### 2. Rondout Lighthouse Foundation Engineering Planning & Design

Funding Source:

**OPRHP Historic Preservation Program** 

Total Grant Project Cost: \$200,000

Application Amount:

\$150,000

Grant Match Required:

25% = \$50,000

Funding will support engineering planning and design and production of bid-ready construction documents to restore the foundation of the historic lighthouse. Over 100 years old, the foundation is in danger of failure due to age and increased frequency and severity of storm surges related to climate change.

#### 3. Kingston Neighborhood Skate Park

**OPRHP Historic Preservation Program**

\$675,000

Grant Match Required:

25% = \$225,000

This project will design and construct a skate park, where community members can safely skateboard, inline skate, or practice specialized bicycle moves. This designated area will be located in Hasbrouck Park. Grant funds will be used to procure design and installation services, and to purchase the components to be installed.

#### 4. Rondout Gardens Community Park

**Funding Source:** 

**OPRHP Heritage Area Program** 

**Total Grant Project Cost:** 

\$100,000 \$75,000

25% = \$25,000

Grant funds will support the engineering design and development of construction documents for a public space adjacent to the Empire State Trail and the Rondout Gardens public housing authority complex. Plans will identify and design improvements to the existing community garden and develop an unused area located next to the garden to include a basketball court and other potential amenities. The plan will consider public feedback, ADA access improvements, general ongoing maintenance, wayfinding, and means to strengthen connections with the surrounding community.

### 5. Kingston Citywide Sidewalk Improvement Plan

**Funding Source:** 

**DEC Climate Smart Communities** 

Total Grant Project Cost: \$250,000

**Application Amount:** 

\$125,000

Grant Match Required:

50% = \$125,000

A sidewalk improvement plan will give the City an action blueprint to improve and create sidewalks that will result in a robust pedestrian network for safe travel. It will build upon the Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan, a Complete Streets Advisory Council white paper on the subject, previously collected baseline sidewalk data, and other City plans and policies.

The Sidewalk Improvement Plan will assess the current state of sidewalks, present other municipal examples, and give options for financial structures. Those options may include but not be limited to a City-wide sidewalk improvement district, a cost-share program, a bond referendum, other State and Federal funding sources, and other grants. It will include details about how each of these options will be structured and their effects, improvements prioritization at the parcel level, and templates and educational materials for implementation. The plan will also include a study of the bluestone used in both historic and non-historic districts.

#### 6. Kingston Local Waterfront Revitalization & Comprehensive Plan Update

The focus of this project is to update the City's Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan (LWRP), originally created in 1992, in conjunction with the Kingston 2025 Comprehensive Plan. Coordinating development of the LWRP with the Comprehensive Plan update is an excellent way to ensure that the City's planning and regulatory framework will meet the City's goals for revitalization of the waterfront and support the natural, cultural, and economic resources so

vital to the City's future. In 2023, a Project Advisory Committee, which included community members and City staff, worked with specialists from PACE University to assess existing conditions and current resources in order to determine resiliency needs for the future. The final document will be used as the basis for updating the 1992 LWRP, which will align with the updated Comprehensive Plan. These documents will build on accomplishments to-date. They will also serve as a guide for future policy-making and actions the City can develop to address needs related to climate change, zoning, open space, housing, parks, infill development, transportation, the economy and more.

#### 7. Center for Photography of Woodstock

Funding Source: NYS Homes and Community Renewal Main Street Program

CPW requests an endorsing resolution to support an application to the NYS Homes and Community Renewal Main Street Program application to build out the third floor (8,000 SF) of the Van Slyke and Horton Building at 25 Dederick Street in Midtown. The third floor is currently unusable because it lacks a secondary means of egress/ingress. The project will enable CPW to make commercial use of this floor by renting out much-needed space—for storage and art fabrication—to artists. Grant funds will pay for constructing the required secondary access (between the second and third floors), as well as bathrooms, commercial art storage and artist studios.

#### 8. Kingston Swimming Facilities Upgrades, Due July 12, 2024

Funding Source: Dormitory Authority of the State of New York - NY Swims Program

Total Grant Project Cost: \$6,500,000

Grant Match Required: 20% = \$1,300,000

This grant will fund improvements to (1) the Andretta Pool and splash pad, which may include ADA upgrades to the existing pool lift; the addition of ADA pool stairs, a shade structure, and new splash pad features; and increasing the splash pad pump capacity; and (2) Kingston Point Beach, including production of final engineering designs, bid-ready construction documents, and construction of the preferred alternative selected during the Kingston Point Phase II Climate Adaptive Design project in 2020. The design will mitigate sea-level rise resulting from climate change, preserve the existing beach as a long-term recreational and ecological asset, and protect inland areas of the beach. Without this work, Kingston Point will likely be submerged within the next 50 years.

#### 9. Safe & Accessible Flatbush & Foxhall Project, Due August 16, 2024

A GRG award will support green infrastructure components included in the final designs for this project, helping to close a funding gap and allowing construction to begin in 2025. The project will fulfill the funder's requirement that the project capture, treat, or reduce the time of concentration for a minimum of 100,000 cubic feet of stormwater runoff annually. It will combine green infrastructure and nature-based features to ensure climate resilient infrastructure. Components include installation of bioswales and stormwater street trees and infrastructure that directs water flow to these components.
