Whereas, Kingston will continue to call on the federal government to continue its efforts to improve the vehicle safety system through advocacy with our federal representatives. By adopting a Safe System Approach, we will continue to use the best available guidance from USDOT / FHWA, NYS DOT, and NACTO to design and redesign our streets to be safer for all users; I hereby
