Re: Veto of Resolution 10 and 12

Dear President Shaut,

I am returning with a veto, Resolution 10 and Resolution 12 of 2021. These resolutions are related to the 2020 Coronavirus CDBG Aid allocated to the City. It is my understanding that a public hearing related to the distribution of this aid was held on Monday January 4th but that the wrong call-in number was provided in the paper of record. This led to no one from the public being able to join the meeting. Community groups who would be affected by the proposed funds did not have an opportunity to comment prior to the Common Council vote.

Additionally, it is my understanding that the recommendations I sent to the committee on November 6th, 2020 were not reviewed by the committee, which is not in alignment with our Community Development Allocation Process. As you know, I voiced these concerns prior to the vote last week, but the council voted anyway, leaving me no choice but to return these two resolutions. It would be my hope that a public hearing could be held this month, in advance of the Community Development meeting, and that my recommendations could be reviewed and the Common Council Committee could vote on a final allocation for this important aid.
