This is a request that the Council authorize a budget transfer in the 2024 budget for the expenditure of funds for NYS DEC Rondout Creek Public Kayak Access project. Funding in the amount of \$50,000 will come from NYS DEC Grant Funding to design and install a new ADA accessible Kayak Launch on the Rondout Creek at TR Gallo Park to replace the old, deteriorated dock.

Re: Improving access to legislative materials

Dear President Shaut,

My office recently became aware of a potential funding opportunity involving New York State's Local Government Records Management Improvement Fund to improve the City's handling of legislative materials. Although the Grants Management Office is unable to prepare a robust application in time for the soon-approaching deadline, I have communicated with Alderman Scott-Childress about the possibility of preparing a grant application for the next funding cycle and coordinating this effort with work to be performed by the Common Council's consultant.

As you know, eCode360, the online Administrative Code resource, can be difficult for some people to navigate and fails to display legislative updates in easy-to-follow fashion; nor does the City's website support text-searching of past resolutions. Improving access to legislative material will benefit the public, my office, which frequently needs to consult archived material, and Alderpersons, who cannot efficiently review prior Common Council actions. I ask that you place this item on the Finance & Audit committee's March agenda so that we can begin discussing these issues
