Dear President Shaut,

As you know, pursuant to the City of Kingston Disposition Policy passed by the Common Council on April 4, 2023 via Resolution 66 of 2023, the City is to offer certain surplus properties to the KCLB for \$1.00.

The Office of Housing Initiatives sent an offer letter to the KCLB for 17 qualifying properties on April 10, 2023. The KCLB responded on June 22, 2023, accepting 7 properties and rejecting 10 others. I am including copies of the offer letter to the Kingston City Land Bank and the Land Bank's response for reference.

I request that the Common Council approve the transfer of these 7 properties to the KCLB. The final payment to the City will depend on the final sales price to the homeowner/end-user. Because of the uncertainty created by the recent Supreme Court *Tyler v. Hennepin* decision on the status of tax foreclosed properties and the impacts of a possible New York State moratorium on foreclosures, I am asking that the Common Council waive the 90-day requirement for the KCLB to take title to the properties following Common Council approval for these 7 properties only.


Thank you for your April 10, 2023 offer letter, sent pursuant to Resolution 66 (2023).

In the spirit of the City's disposition policy—and our organizational intent to partner with other local mission-oriented organizations/the broader Kingston community and return properties to the tax rolls—we offered upon our purchase from the City to transfer some of these properties at-cost to Ulster YouthBuild, Habitat for Humanity of Ulster County, the Kingston Land Trust (KLT) and adjacent neighbors.

Unfortunately, Ulster YouthBuild and Habitat for Humanity of Ulster County stated they were too busy to consider taking on additional properties. Thankfully, the KLT and one adjacent neighbor are excited to work with us to purchase and improve two properties from the list (250-256R Third Avenue for the KLT and 283 W. O'Reilly for the neighbor) we are accepting your offer on. With this letter, our commitments to transfer these properties to these purchasers are tied to your commitment to dispose to us.

Similarly, as you are aware our commitments to develop some of the properties we are accepting using the State's recent \$1.8MM award to us under the Land Bank Initiative, Phase II funds are also now tied to our assertion to the Governor and her team that we so we will do so expeditiously. RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON, NEW YORK AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF SURPLUS PROPERTIES TO THE KINGSTON CITY LAND BANK

Sponsored by: Finance & Audit Committee Aldermen: Scott-Childress, Olivieri, Dennison, Hirsch, Schabot

WHEREAS, via Resolution 66 of 2023 the City of Kingston approved a policy for the disposition of surplus City-owned property acquired through the tax foreclosure process; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Disposition Policy is to ensure City of Kingston follows a standardized and transparent procedure for the sale of City-owned surplus property and especially to encourage the development of affordable rental and homeownership housing opportunities; and

WHEREAS, on April 10, 2023, the City of Kingston offered seventeen properties to the Kingston City Land Bank in line with Section II of the Disposition Policy; and

WHEREAS, on June 22, 2023 the Kingston City Land Bank accepted seven properties and rejected ten others.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That ownership of 28 Abbey (48.82-4-37), 177 Murray (56.35-8-12), 35-37 Hanratty (56.35-6-10), 43 Teller (48.74-2-6) 283 W. O'Reilly (56.41-2-21), 291-303 W. O'Reilly (56.41-2-23), and 250-256R Third Avenue (48.83-6-10) shall be transferred to the Kingston City Land bank for rehabilitation/redevelopment and disposition for a total amount of \$1.00 per property.

SECTION 2. That upon final sale of each property, the Kingston City Land Bank shall remit an additional payment to the City in accordance with the fee schedule of the City of Kingston Disposition Policy.

SECTION 3: That the City of Kingston's Corporation Counsel and the Kingston City Land Bank may mutually agree on a date for final closing.

SECTION 4: That the Mayor is hereby authorized to sign any and all documents, including quitclaim deeds, conveying the City of Kingston's interest in surplus property in accordance with the City's Disposition Policy.

SECTION 5. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.
