Dear President Shaut:

I request that two stop signs be placed on Washington Avenue at the intersection with Marius Street at George Washington Elementary, one heading in each direction. There are two reasons for this request.

1. There has been a series of crashes in the area of 55-65 Washington Avenue: five in the two months of August and September. These have ranged from a clipped rear-view mirror to a crash that flipped one car and totaled another. A stop sign at Marius, particularly an oversized one with red reflective tape, would slow traffic down and reduce the likelihood of further incidents.
2. There has been a school-crossing guard at this intersection in the past. But apparently KPD has been unable to hire a replacement. Despite the yellow lights that flash during school opening and closing hours, parents report there is still danger from speeding vehicles. A stop sign would cause cars to slow to a stop to enable the young children to cross the street in greater safety.

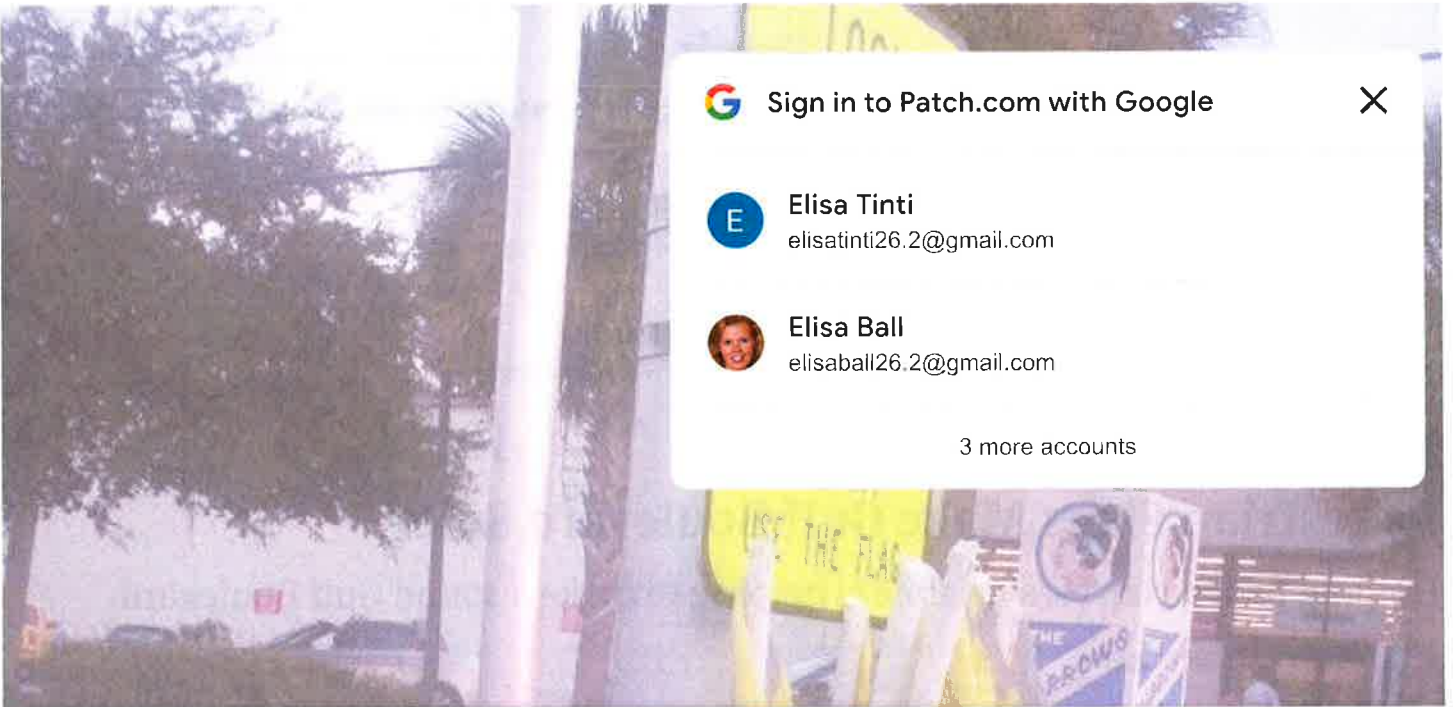
