I have received numerous complaints regarding high speed traffic on Hone Street, between Spring Street and Hunter Street. There are stop signs on Hunter Street at the intersection of Hone and Hunter but none coming down the steep grade of Hone Street. Since the Wurts Street bridge has closed for repairs, the traffic on Spring and Hone has increased, as vehicles travel from the Loughran Bridge enroute to Abeel Street.

There is also an increase in traffic on evenings when softball games are played at Block Park.

I suggest a 4 way stop at the intersection on Hone and Hunter to order to curtail speeding.
