CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

OF THE

CITY OF KINGSTON LOCAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION
UNDER SECTION 402 & 1411 OF THE NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATION LAW

We, the undersigned, being desirous of forming a Local Development Corporation pursuant to Article XIV of the Not-For-Profit Corporations Law of the State of New York, hereby make, subscribe, acknowledge and file this certificate stating as follows:

FIRST, The name of the Corporation shall be the CITY OF KINGSTON LOCAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

development corporation shall be a nonprofit local development corporation organized under Article XIV of the Not-For-Profit Corporation Law and operated exclusively for the charitable or public purposes of relieving and reducing unemployment, promoting and providing for additional and maximum employment, bettering and maintaining job opportunities, promoting instruction or training of individuals to improve or develop their capabilities for such jobs, including the carrying on of scientific research for such purposes, for the purpose of aiding the territory in which its operations are principally to be conducted by attracting new business and industry to such area, or by encouraging the development of, or retention of, business and industry in such territory and lessening the burdens of government and acting in the public interest.

THIRD: In furtherance of said purpose, the corporation shall have the following powers:

- (a) To construct, acquire, rehabilitate and improve for the use by others industrial, commercial or manufacturing buildings of plants within the territory in which its operations are principally to be conducted, to assist financially in such construction, acquisition, rehabilitation and improvement, to maintain such buildings of plants for others in such territory; to disseminate information and furnish advice, technical assistance and liarson with federal, state and local authorities with respect thereto;
- (b) To acquire by purchase, lease, gift, bequest, devise of otherwise, real or personal property or interests therein;

- (d) Without leave of the court, to sell, lease, mortgage of otherwise dispose of or encumber any such buildings or plants or any portions thereof or any of its real or personal property or any interest therein upon such terms as it may determine;
- (e) In connection with loans from New York Job Development Authority, to enter into covenants and agreements and to comply with all the terms, conditions and provisions thereof, and otherwise to carry out its corporate purposes and to foster and encourage the location or expansion of industrial, commercial or manufacturing buildings or plants within the territory in which its operations are principally to be conducted; and
- (f) To do all and everything suitable for the accomplishment of any of the foregoing purposes.

FOURTH: The Corporation shall be a nonprofit corporation. All

income and earnings of the corporation shall be used exclusively for its corporate purposes or accrue and be paid to the New York Job Development Authority. No part of the income or earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the bemefit or profit of, nor shall any distribution of its property or assets be made to any members or private person, corporate or individual, or any other private interest; provided that, the Corporation may repay loans and repay contributions made to it, but only if and to the extent that any such contributions may not be allowable as a deduction in computing taxable income under the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

FIFTH: Nothing contained in this certificate shall authorize or empower the corporation to perform or engage in any lect or practice probabilited by the General Business Law, section 340, or other antimonoloply or antitiust statute of the State of New York.

SIXTH: The corporation shall not attempt to influence legislation by propaganda or otherwise, or participate or intervene, directly or indirectly, in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

SEVENTH: None of the directors, officers, members or employees of the corporation shall receive or be lawfully entitled to receive any pecuniary profit from the operation thereof but may receive reasonable compensation for services rendered and property delivered in effecting one or more of its corporation purposes.

EIGHTH: The principal office of the corporation is to be

located in the

County of Ulster, New York.

NINTH: The number of its director shall be not less than 3 nor more than 40. A director must be a member.
